Submissions of Original Manuscripts

All manuscripts should be submitted in advance (by 15 August 2018, latest) by E-mail to the Edito, Dr. Akira Kimura (a-kimura@paz.ac.jp).

One paper copy of each manuscript is to be presented to the organizers in connection with the check-in for the Conference. The maximum length of each manuscript is 15 pages (A4 size) including tables, figures and references. Authors should bear in mind that only original abstracts and manuscripts will be processed and published. The final output of the Conference will be a new kind of well-being oriented compilation. It will consist of reviewed and edited

C ity of Takasaki

Takasaki, From the long tradition of transportation, the bifurcation point of Nakasendo (National Route 17, National Route 18) and Mikuni Highway (Gunma Prefectural Route 25 Takasaki Shibukawa Line), the branch point of the Kanetsu Expressway and the Kita Kanto Expressway, the Joetsu Shinkansen and the Hokuriku It also serves as a branch point for the Shinkansen, which is one of the nationwide leading transportation cities. The Takasaki station which stops the bullet train is also the gateway to Maebashi City, the prefectural capital of Gunma Prefecture, and it is the traffic center of Gunma Prefecture. In Heisei's great merger, we incorporated Kurabuchi village, Minouchi cho, Gunma town, Shincho town, Haruna cho and even Yoshii town, and has become one of the prefecture's population in vast city area. The population of the metropolitan area is about 530,000, and it is the size of the metropolitan area as one in the prefecture [Note 1]. At the public land price, Takasaki City occupies the highest point in the prefecture, both commercial and residential areas. The central area of the city (central urban area) is an area centered around Takasaki cho in the former Gunma gun.

In the Edo period as a castle town of the Takasaki clan, Nakasendo 69 As a fourth largest lodging town on the fourth largest, as a town of distribution and commerce of goods greatly crowded. The city stood in Tamachi, Honmachi, Shinmachi (present: Ara-machi) of the highway road, and it seems that the appearance is as if "Edo looking is Takasaki Tamachi, navy goodwill is fluttering". A blacksmith in the smith town, a swordsmith in the sheath town, goldsmith in the Shirogane Town, the town of the craftsman at that time still holds the town name. In modern times it is also a popular commercial city in the prefecture. In addition, wholesale town located in the suburbs of Takasaki is the first suburban wholesale complex in Japan. Transportation

Takasaki is easy to reach. The distance from Tokyo to Takasaki by road is about 150 km and there are numerous daily express coach services. Takasaki Tonyamachi town is located at the station heading north one from JR Takasaki station.

It is located in the venue 8 minutes walking from Takasaki wholesale town.

JR Takasaki station is 1 hour from the Tokyo station by bullet train.

Positionally it is located near the center of the mainland of Japan.

Takasaki belongs to Gunma prefecture and is a minor as a tourist destination, but it is a delicious region of one of the leading hot springs and jiba in Japan.

V enue and Hotel Accommodations

Takasaki with an academic venue is one hour away from Tokyo by bullet train. We recommend taking hotels around JR Takasaki Station.

The conference ride is carried out at Gunma Perth University 1 building.
